Dal-Dil-Vog Wins Demo Listen Derby

It is a cause to celebrate.

Dal-Dil-Vog is this year's winner of Demo Listen Derby. *Oh Ya Jo* is the song that got the band to the Commodore Ballroom, where the finals took place in June.

It was an unlikely victory. Dal-Dil-Vog is a seven member band that combines the bhangra rhythms of Indian culture with contemporary rock. The band sings in Hindi, Punjabi and English. "This is awesome!" said *Blake Havard*, second place winner, as he watched Dal-Dil-Vog. Also watching with smiles on their face were members of *Gonch Messiah*, third place finalist.

Havard, who showed his pedigree by finishing his set with a Mott the Hoople, and Cheap Trick song, is a straight ahead rocker with a band that is there for him all the way. Gonch Messiah not only plays funk with style but also tongue-in-cheek wit - at least to judge by the ironing board that serves as a keyboard stand.
